## Aims

Innovation in policy, planning and action is necessary to address complex wellbeing issues such as community safety, childhood development, food security, water quality and the management of chronic disease conditions. Key questions include: How can we develop community settings and service systems which support people's capacity for well being? How can persistent patterns of inequalities in access to opportunities and resources for wellbeing be addressed?
