The 3rd Thinking on Two Wheels International Cycling Conference will be held in Adelaide, Australia on Monday 15th and Tuesday 16th January 2007 and will be hosted by the University of South Australia (UniSA).

### Timing

The Conference immediately precedes the Tour Down Under six-day cycle race, the most prestigious international professional cycle race in Australia. Delegates who stay after the conference may wish to participate in the *be active* Tour, joining nearly 3,000 other recreational cyclists in riding a stage of the Tour Down Under in the morning before the professional riders take to the bitumen.

Delegates who intend to experience the delights of Adelaide can include this once-a-year event on their 'Things To Do' list alongside savouring the delights of the produce from the world-famous Barossa Valley, Clare Valley, McLaren Vale and Adelaide Hills wine districts in the convivial cafes of the dining precincts of Adelaide.

### Venue

The venue for the conference is the Hilton Adelaide Hotel, the premier accommodation and function venue for the Tour Down Under. The Hilton Adelaide is situated on Victoria Square, home to the Tour Village in the heart of Adelaide where the public can watch and discuss race preparations with team members.

### Cycling, UniSA and Thinking on Two Wheels

The Thinking on Two Wheels conference venue and timing will ensure an exciting and rewarding gathering of industry, sporting, government and academic people in the cycling capital of Australia. UniSA is at the forefront of conducting research, and promoting debate and discussion on cycling issues concerned with:

- health;
- recreation;
- community;
- engineering; and
- sustainable transport.

UniSA has for many years sponsored a team in the Tour Down Under and actively promotes cycling as a healthy, fun activity that can directly encourage a sustainable transport system and sustainable lifestyle choices.



### Conference Themes and Submission Details

The conference has the themes of health, recreation, community, engineering and sustainable transport elements of cycling as its core but papers covering other aspects of cycling are welcome.

The Conference is calling for abstracts from practitioners, consultants, government officers, community people and academics who wish to present their recent work. Authors of abstracts can choose either:

1. to submit an abstract describing a presentation they wish to make at the conference (ie abstract and presentation only); or
2. to submit an abstract with the intention of the full paper being peer-reviewed by an independent panel prior to publication of refereed proceedings under the proviso that a presentation of the paper is made at the conference (ie abstract, paper and presentation).

Abstracts for all presentations will be available to delegates at the conference. All peer-reviewed papers will be published on CD and selected papers will be included in a special issue of an appropriate journal.
