WHAT IS *THINKING ON TWO WHEELS*?

Increasingly, cycling is a popular competitive sport, means of transport, tourist activity and a great way to stay fit and healthy. It is appropriate that the University of South Australia, who sponsor a cycling team in the Jacob's Creek Tour Down Under, be at the forefront of conducting research, and promoting debate and discussion on cycling issues concerned with health, recreation, tourism and sustainable transport.

Thinking On Two Wheels comprises a one day seminar/workshop on Monday the 17th January 2005, the day before the start of the Jacob's Creek Tour Down Under. The emphasis of the seminar presentations and the workshops will be to promote cycling as a healthy, fun activity that can directly encourage a sustainable transport system and sustainable lifestyle choices.

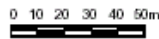
