In 2005 he was asked to give testimony on Peak Oil before the United States House of Representatives Subcommittee on Energy and Air Quality. In 2007 he was asked to write a report for the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, [OECD](#), about future global oil production to serve as a background document for the first International Transport Forum in Leipzig, in May, 2008.
